ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The unaudited interim condensed financial statements have been prepared using the same accounting policies as those adopted in the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024, and in accordance with the Bank of Mauritius Guidelines on Public Disclosure of Information and IAS 34 'Interim Financial Reporting'. There have been no new standards or interpretations, which have been adopted in the three months ended 31 March 2025.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The first quarter of 2025 started on a positive note with a strong increase in Operating profit which reached Rs 115 million, up by 13% as compared to the corresponding period of last year.

Net interest income was up by 16% to reach Rs 207 million, benefiting from lower interest expenses payable on borrowings as the Bank continues to benefit from its increased deposit base. Despite a challenging local market FX environment, profit arising from forex transactions reached Rs 16.5 million over the period ended 31 March 2025.

Operating expenses increased by 10% to reach Rs 128 million, mainly driven by increases in personnel expenses. The resulted cost-to-income ratio reached 52.8%, compared to 53.3% over the same period of last year.

Over the quarter ended 31 March 2025, an impairment provision release of Rs 3.1 million was recognised, as compared to a significant charge of Rs 55 million booked on a cross-border asset for the first quarter of 2024.

The effect of the above positively impacted the profit after tax which increased by 130% cover the same period of last year to reach Rs 103 million.

The loans and advances to banks and customers were up by 3% to reach Rs 22.1 billion over the year ended 31 December 2024 and the deposits base reached Rs 25.4 billion as at end of the first quarter 2025.

The Bank closed the first quarter of its financial year with sound capital and liquidity positions

ECONOMIC OUTLOOK 2025

The Bank remains optimistic and aspire to take advantage of significant growth opportunities which will continue to come from the Bank's underlying segments and products. This, will be, despite a drop in the general interest rate environment.

The Bank expects the following as Outlook for FY 2025:

- 1) Income growth to be sustained based on the encouraging results of YTD March 2025.
- 2) Strong costs discipline management to maintain a good costs to income ratio.
- 3) Solid capital and liquidity positions to close the year over minimum regulatory requirements
